

## Vindomora Country Lodges - BBQ

<b>Hazards Identified</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Injuries - Burns to hands, arms, chest and face</li> <li>▪ Carbon Monoxide Poisoning</li> <li>▪ Chimney / Fire involving BBQ</li> <li>▪ Scorching or Burning of nearby Objects, clothing</li> <li>▪ Lodge Fire</li> <li>▪ High touch areas – risk of coronavirus transmission</li> <li>▪ Dust when cleaning – risk to health</li> </ul>
<b>Hazard-Specific Personal Protective Equipment for Staff</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Supportive Footwear with enclosed toes, heels and non-slip soles</li> <li>▪ Full PPE and adequate cleaning products</li> </ul>
<b>Hazard-Specific Training for Staff</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ None Identified regarding use – This notice to be present in the Visitors Information Pack and on the website.</li> <li>▪ Full PPE when cleaning</li> </ul>
<b>Related Safe Practices and Procedures</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Fire Extinguishers in each lodge and externally</li> <li>▪ Fire Bucket containing fire suppression product</li> <li>▪ Fire Safety Policy</li> <li>▪ Fire Safety Evacuation policy printed in each Visitor Information Pack and on the website</li> </ul>

### Safe Practice

- A safe BBQ is conducted by using charcoal, matches and on occasions a small amount of firelighters.
- Only use enough charcoal to cover the base to a depth of about 50mm / 2 inches
- Ignition fluids and in particular petrol, are not to be used to assist ignition or during the use of the BBQ
- Keep all loose clothing away from the BBQ
- Keep children and pets away from the cooking area.
- NEVER leave the BBQ unattended when in use.
- When cool, remove the ash and empty inside a bag.

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- Children MUST be supervised AT ALL TIMES when BBQ's are in use.
- Tell children about the high surface temperatures and keep them away from the BBQ so they avoid getting burned or igniting their clothes.
- Do not place clothing or other flammable material on or near the BBQ.
- Keep combustible materials away from the BBQ to avoid the possibility of igniting such materials. (E.g. clothing, furniture, newspapers, books)
- Fire extinguishers are located in each lodge. A Fire Bucket is next to each BBQ.
- Smoke from charcoal and other material that is not burned completely contains a number of chemicals, including Carbon Monoxide (CO<sub>2</sub>) which is odorless, colourless and can be deadly.
- In the event of a fire, dial 999 and follow the Fire Evacuation procedures.
